Dear Sandra Warren,

Thank you for your email and attached letter regarding your interpretation of a political leaflet that was distributed in the St Michaels ward.

The information within the leaflet outlines the belief that the Green party Councillors submitted objections on behalf of the community and residents, which is I understand correct.

I have attached a council question which was submitted by Cllr Coyne to the City Council meeting on 15th Oct 2008. Cllr Coyne in my view clearly offered information in the question regarding the Community Centre on Lark Lane, which one would assume meant that there would be NO objections to the centre being utilised for use by the homeless. Imagine the frustration when we were informed that the application had been reconsidered and withdrawn owing to objections, submitted by the Green party Councillors on behalf of the residents.

The Liberal Democrats working with the Officers then had to look elsewhere, which we did successfully, meaning the homeless in our city during a very cold winter had accommodation to stay safe and warm in.

Councillor Coyne also requested in the question that I personally looked at using the Town Hall as accommodation (para 4). Is this a return to Liverpool in the bad old days!

As somebody who has been in this city all of my life, I remember the tactics of the Militant Labour party, who called public meetings, inviting other political parties to engage in a slanging match.
